



A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

After reading and listening to the many comments in this industry on the perceived roles of the various groups and organizations, I find that many people perhaps do not understand the structure and the functions of these industry organizations and how they arrived at the positions they are in today. We seem to have a serious ambivalence among us as to just what we want TWHBEA in particular to be and how it should interact with the rest of the industry.

I have been in the Walking horse industry for 40+ years. I have seen TWHBEA go from the only game in town to an organization which, according to some in the other competing organizations that have been formed, can and should function from a Motel 6 rented room TWHBEA is a government recognized organization empowered by the United States Department of Agriculture in 1935 to maintain the stud books and to record the pedigrees of the Tennessee walking horse, an animal that has been selectively developed to have the ability to

perform the unique gaits, the flat walk and running walk. Just as an aside, this fact puts them in direct conflict with the most powerful lobby group in this country HSUS whose CEO Wayne Pacelle has said ""We have no problems with the extinction of domestic animals. They are creations of human selective breeding."

— Wayne Pacelle, HSUS President, Animal People News." Along with the accuracy of the registration paperwork, TWHBEA's mission statement and bylaws include the ability to govern the entire TWH industry from the rail to the trail, to protect the welfare of this breed and to ensure its survival into the future. It is structurally set up to be the mother ship, with the sails manned by members. TWHBEA (and WHOA) are currently the ONLY member driven organizations in this industry where the stake holders can directly influence the course of the Tennessee Walking Horse industry.

TWHBEA is an international membership driven organizational structure that DEMANDS fiscal accountability and operational transparency. Guaranteed in the bylaws is the ability of every member to review the fiscal accounting statements, the minutes of the meetings, attend Committee meetings, International Board meetings and Executive meetings, and to DIRECTLY influence policy through their vote and in turn the votes of their elected representatives.

And yet we hear two divergent camps screaming at TWHBEA to either "shut up and just register horses" and then in the next breathe excoriate them for doing just that, and not doing "something" about the current state of the industry. Where are these voices coming from? Are they actual members, and if so are they involved by their participation in the actual policy making boards and committees of THWBEA, or if not that, even as little as bothering to vote in an election. I am constantly hearing "they, they, they, in referencing what TWHBEA does, yet in all truth the words are WE, WE, WE, that must be used, for TWHBEA is the "WE" that have not turned our backs on the breed in its entirety.

As with the rest of society we have reflected within the industry a philosophy of both "not my fault" and "I'm picking up my marbles and leaving". Understand, TWHBEA in its very core is likened to the United States Government, the structure is sound but it will only function as well or as poorly as we the citizens of both this country and TWHBEA demand. It is all inclusive. To abdicate membership in TWHBEA is akin to renouncing citizenship in the US.

Where else within this industry is it guaranteed in the very bylaws, that YOU have a VOICE.

Where else in this industry is there an organization that MUST respond to YOUR VOICE.

To those who are not happy with that response, look into the mirror because it is YOUR response.

Membership gives you that VOICE and that response.

TWHNC SANCTIONS McCONNELL

SHELBYVILLE – In a precedent setting move, the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration took decisive action today, both denouncing and condemning the actions of trainer Jackie McConnell, who was both videotaped abusing a horse and admitted to a Horse Protection Act violation in federal court today.

The TWHNC Board of Directors voted to suspend McConnell for life and also took the following action:

- (1) suspended McConnell for life from entering the TWHNC grounds for any and events, regardless of the event's affiliation or ownership.
- (2) voted to permanently remove Mr. McConnell's name from the list of Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration Hall of Fame inductees. Any picture, plaque, image or other mention of his name from Hall of Fame data will be permanently removed from this day forward and his name will be forever erased from Hall of Fame rolls.
- (3) voted to permanently remove any and all pictures and signage on the Celebration grounds carrying either the name of Jackie McConnell or the likeness.
- (4) banned from entry onto the TWHNC grounds any horse under the custodianship or presumed to be under the custodianship of Mr. McConnell

"This action is the strongest we can take and it clearly reflects our disgust with the actions of Mr. McConnell,"said Dr. Doyle Meadows, TWHNC CEO. "His actions are not reflective of the Tennessee Walking Horse industry, and we in no way want him associated with our show."

TWHNC SPONSORS

Sponsors with financial and emotional ties to the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration, some with family roots deep in the multimillion dollar sport, have risen to defend the industry after PepsiCo dropped its support because of shocking video of a trainer scarring and beating horses to get the perfect gait.

"We're still in it and have no intention of pulling out," said Joe Green Jr., manager of the Shelbyville Farm Center, a feed and supply operation that caters to Middle Tennessee's huge equine community.

"The Celebration (held in late August every year) is like the Super Bowl for us, and horse people are our biggest customers."

Last week's decision by the giant soft drink brand to withdraw its \$25,000 sponsorship of the walking horse event came after ABC-TV's Nightline news show aired an undercover video of horses being beaten in a trainer's barn in Collierville, Tenn. That West Tennessee trainer,

Jackie McConnell, had his license revoked late last week by the state association after the video aired.

"Pepsi withdrew their sponsorship, but they're the only ones that have," said Dr. Doyle Meadows, chief executive of the Walking Horse National Celebration, part of the business fabric in this tight-knit town 50 miles south of Nashville.

Rather than sparking a mass exodus of money and bookings by other advertisers and corporate sponsors, the fresh criticism of the horse industry has spurred numerous defenders to action.

TV report criticized

Rutherford County-based Celebration Feeds, a division of Burkmann Feeds in Danville, Ky., took its name from the Shelbyville walking horse showcase and counts horse owners among its best customers. It specializes in premium horse feed.

Division manager Joe Green Sr., whose son runs Shelbyville Farm Center, called the Nightline report "a bad picture."

"The good guys have tried so hard to make it right, then that bad guy comes along and tries to ruin it for everybody. We try to be involved in all breeds, but the Celebration is the bulk of our business," the elder Green said. "This won't deter our support."

Turning prized horses into higher steppers by "soring" — painful cutting and chemical treatments on the animals' legs — has plagued the industry for decades. Critics and animal rights activists contend owners and trainers won't stop the problem for fear of losing championships if a classic stepper loses height on its gait.

The Nightline segment relied on undercover video by the Humane Society of the United States. It revealed cruel beatings and chemical drips on a horse's legs to force a very high, "big lick" gait, which is popular among the judges at competitive shows.

People sticking up for the walking horse industry say the video showed a renegade trainer — not horse lovers — at work. These defenders say soring is no longer common practice, especially at national events such as the Shelbyville show, the world's most prominent walking horse exhibition, which draws 250,000 visitors to Middle Tennessee in late August.

"The walking horse industry has been under such a microscope for so long that most of the bad guys have been weeded out, and it was unfortunate that ABC tried to paint all of them as bad," argues the younger Green, who sells animal feed and farm supplies. "The way they did that TV piece wasn't even journalism."

Self-policing is hard

Meadows said only 1 percent of the horses entered in last August's Celebration showed signs of soring during U.S. Agriculture Department inspections, down from 13 percent in 2009. Others argue that the practice has gone deeper underground and self-policing by the

horses appear healthy even when injured.

Soring has been illegal under the federal Horse Protection Act since 1970. But federal veterinarians charged with enforcing the law can make it to only a few horse shows because of budget constraints. That's where self-regulation by the industry comes into play. The horse industry hires inspectors, but critics say they aren't always thorough enough, and more federal oversight is needed.

A check of USDA Horse Protection Act violations reveals that inspectors issued more citations to Shelbyville trainers than any other horse industry organization for 2010-11.

What's clear about the horse business in Tennessee is that it's a big money maker, and walking horses are a major component of that.

U.S. Sen. Lamar Alexander is vowing to push for better enforcement.

"Anyone who cares about horses should be shocked by this video, which is why there is a 52-count criminal indictment under the U.S. Horse Protection Act," Alexander said in a news release. "I will work in the senate to strengthen the act and add more money to enforce it. The walking horse industry should step up its self-policing so that a few bad actors don't destroy one of our state's most treasured traditions."

Events draw dollars

A University of Tennessee Department of Agricultural Economics study of spending, sales and jobs in 2010 found that equine businesses and their spinoffs — across all breeds of horses — provided a \$1.4 billion economic impact for the state.

According to an equine census five years ago, Tennessee ranked sixth nationally for the number of horses and ponies owned. About 40 percent of horses statewide were classified as Tennessee walkers, known for their small, well-placed ears, sloping shoulders and short back. Perhaps 15,000 walking horses are bred to compete.

Shelbyville, and its showpiece Calsonic Arena, are crown jewels of the walking horse business.

Meadows' organization operates the 105-acre Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration Grounds in Shelbyville, which hosts the annual event over 11 days. Hundreds of other walking horse shows are held throughout the U.S.

Nearly a quarter-million fans come to Shelbyville's Celebration from as many as 40 states, Meadows said. The complex has 53 barns with 1,500 stalls. There is an outdoor stadium that seats 30,000, along with a 4,500-seat indoor arena.

Smaller events are held there 40 weekends a year, including a threeday spring fun show, a mini-version of the main walking horse show set for Thursday through Saturday this week.

industry doesn't work since evidence of soring may be hidden to make Losing Pepsi's \$25,000 contribution as a sponsor "is unfortunate," but the soft drink company will lose even more, Meadows contends. That's because only Pepsi products were being sold at events in the complex, which brought in more than \$50,000 in revenue each year for Pepsi during the main Celebration alone.

> Pepsi had been a sponsor since 2010. Middle Tennessee Ford dealers have been supporting the Celebration for about 18 years, and that's probably not going to change, Meadows said, although he added that he hadn't talked with anyone from Ford.

> Jack Pirtle, general manager of Mark Pirtle Ford in Shelbyville, said he can't imagine the dealers pulling their support.

"The Celebration has been here for years and is very important to the community," he said. "Of course, I don't want to see anyone mistreat an animal. But to paint a broad stroke on the industry because of one person's mistreatment is not right."

Some sponsors put up big dollars to play a part in the Walking Horse National Celebration, which offers corporate sponsorships from \$6,500 on the low end to \$250,000 as title sponsor. Perks include box seats, VIP parking, advertising signage, electronic message board scrawls and access to exclusive mailing lists.

'Isolated incident'

Longtime event sponsor Yearwood Equipment Co., a farm equipment dealer in Fayetteville, Tenn., also is backing the industry.

"This was really an isolated incident, and I hate it as bad as anybody," said P.D. Shelton, Yearwood's manager. "But I wouldn't be supporting the Celebration if I thought that was what they were about.

"I believe they will come through it OK, but it's going to hurt every breeder, every trainer," he said. "The trainers as a whole have been doing an outstanding job getting these horses ready to show naturally."

Another vocal supporter is the Tennessee Farmers Co-Op, based in La Vergne, which has feed and farm supply stores.

"I did see the story, and I can tell you that we will be continuing our support of the Celebration," said Joe Huffine, manager of corporate and member services for the group, which is owned by its 70,000 Tennessee farmer members.

"We don't condone what has come out the past few days from a few individuals, and we're saddened by that," he said. "The story does raise some concern. It's unacceptable conduct, but it is not the norm. Are we going to do what Pepsi did? Of course not. We want to do everything we can to promote Tennessee agriculture."

Jennifer Jordan, who operates J. Jordan Boutique on the square in Shelbyville, said her business is closely connected with the Celebration and her sponsorship won't be affected.

"I have a lot of customers who show horses, and they're just great

people," she said. "Do I think regulations should be in place and enforced to prevent soring? Yes, and that's what they're doing. But I don't think this should shut down the horse show."

And, when finances allow, the Association works to promote the Tennessee Walking Horse and the breed registry around the world.

During difficult times, there is often a tendency to attribute, based on how other major breeds are organized, a certain level of overall authority to TWHBEA. However, the actual reality is that TWHBEA has NO authority over most areas of the breed, including the rules that govern horse shows, judging of horse shows, pre and post-show inspections and the licensing of Tennessee Walking Horse trainers. All of these areas are governed either by the various USDA certified horse industry organizations or by professional groups such as the Walking Horse Trainers' Association, Walking Horse Owners' Association, etc. TWHBEA's rule-making and enforcement capabilities lie strictly in the area of the breed registry and the various marketing programs

offered by the Association.

As the breed registry and oldest organization devoted to the Tennessee Walking Horse, TWHBEA is unequivocal in its stance that horse abuse should not be tolerated in any area of the breed. To that end, the Association is committed to working with all of the other Tennessee Walking Horse industry organizations to ensure the welfare of each and every horse.




more evident than at the Champions Arena on Wednesday evening, May 23. In the LONG food line, generations of walking horse families were represented, as well as, those from numerous states.




